Preface

The Second World War has changed the face of the world. Not just because of the tragic experiences it brought to the nations conquered by the German Nazism and the Soviet Communism, but also because it has become, and still continues to be, the point of reference for international public historical debate.

From the Polish perspective, the questions of German and Soviet terror, as well as the situation of the Jewish community in the occupied territories, are some of the most important research areas. This is shown by numerous scientific and popularizing publications, as well as educational projects, that have broadened the awareness of the drama of the world armed conflict of 80 years ago.

The Second World War was a particularly tragic experience for the citizens of the Republic of Poland. The German and Soviet aggression on Polish soil in September 1939 has resulted in the extermination of the Polish nation by both occupiers. The introduction of a universal terror system and the criminal operations aimed at Poland's citizens have resulted in the death, imprisonment or deportation of millions of people.

The Holocaust carried out by the German occupiers has become an unprecedented crime, affecting Jews, including millions of those who were citizens of the Second Polish Republic. The decisive stage of the extermination of the Jewish people in German-occupied Poland commenced 80 years ago, in March 1942, when the Aktion Reinhardt was started, among others. Apart from concentration (labour) camps, the occupiers started creating the extermination camps, in which, first of all, they murdered Jewish people, shipped in from the liquidated ghettos.

In this situation, the assistance provided to Jews by the Poles in the occupied country was of particular importance. This year, we also celebrate the 80th anniversary of the establishment of the 'Żegota' Council for Aid to Jews at the Polish Underground State, the only such underground organization in the enslaved Europe. The memory of the tragedy of Polish Jews and the attempts to provide help to them, despite the fact that the German occupiers punished this with death, has a significance that shapes our community identity.

The issues of the Second World War are among the most frequently described in the publications of the Institute of National Remembrance. Historians present the activities of the Polish Underground State and describe the Soviet and German terror against Poles. One of the most important subjects is the activities of the German occupiers against Jews and the Polish-Jewish relations. This year's anniversaries make it worth paying attention to the publications devoted to these issues.

Without a doubt, the publications presented in this catalogue have expanded our knowledge of the Second World War II history significantly, and these issues are important for the Institute of National Remembrance, and will remain so in the following years.

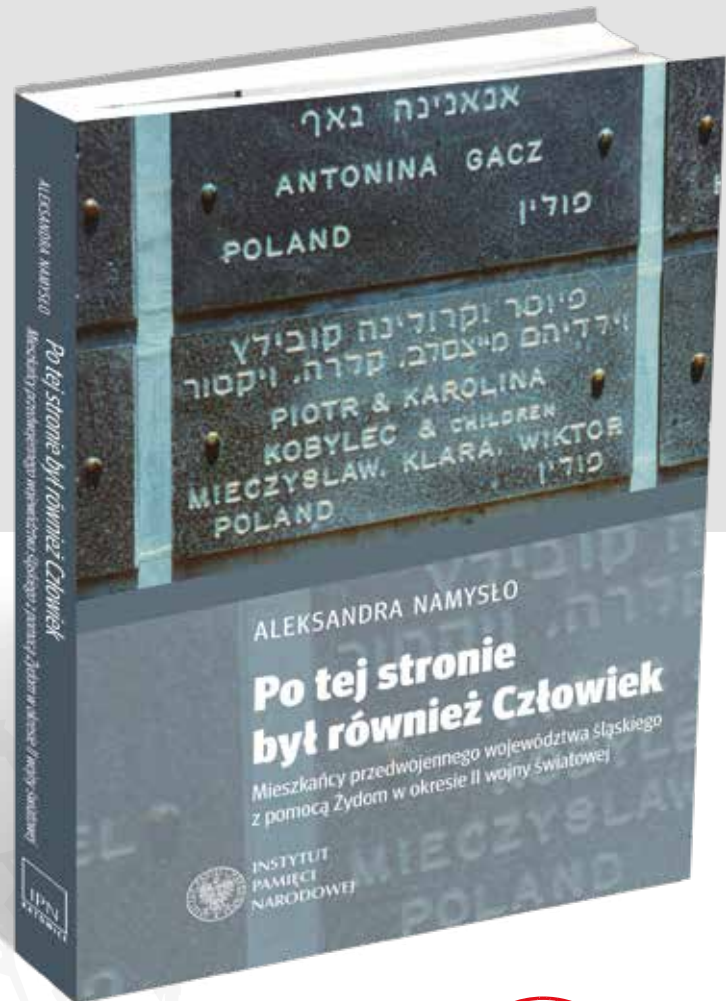

The book discusses the activities of people within the pre-WW2 Poland's Upper Silesia to assist local Jews as well as Jewish prisoners of the concentration camps and labor camps located in the area. Various positive attitudes have been illustrated with descriptions of individual stories of saving Jewish people in the area. These concern 162 people, over 96 percent of

which provided shelter, while others acted as intermediaries in finding a hiding place or provided ad hoc assistance. 112 of the helpers were awarded the title of Righteous Among the Nations by Yad Vashem.
