

SPECIAL ARREST LIST FOR POLAND SONDERFACHDUNGSLISTE POLEN

It covered Polish citizens, who according to the Germans were hostile to the Third Reich and were to be arrested.

The list was created thanks to the spying activities of the Germans living in Poland, employees of German diplomatic missions and agents working for the Third Reich.



After the Einsatzgruppen entered Poland, the local Germans have started to create new arrest warrants. It is estimated that all the arrest warrants had a total of approx.

Suppression by the Polish Army of the German diversion in Bydgoszcz (death of 365 people, mainly Germans)

3 SEP



4 SEP

Establishment of EG z.b.V. in Gliwice (This was the special purpose group, originally operating in Upper Silesia)

The Einsatzgruppen change their names. They were responsible for the death of thousands of people

9 SEP

Establishment of EG VI in Frankfurt (Oder) (Its aim was to pacify the region of Wielkopolska)

12 SEP

In Gdańsk, the Einsatzkommando 16 is formed (It was the smallest EG formation acting as a firing squad. It was responsible for the death of thousands of people)

1-12 SEP

Forming of the German sabotage organisation Volksdeutscher Selbstschutz
